

Sports Premium Statement

In 2014-15, in 2015-2016 and again in 2016-2017 the government has committed to providing primary schools with additional funding for PE. Please find below a summary of our commitment to PE and sport in general.

We are proud of the PE curriculum and sporting opportunities that we have on offer at Alington & Bergh Apton CE VA Primary School. We achieved the bronze Sainsbury's School games Kitemark and are looking to develop this to at least Silver by Sept 2016 . We believe that sport not only contributes to the physical development of pupils but also makes a significant contribution to pupils' personal well-being and enjoyment of school. Our aim is to provide at least two hours of PE provision per week, whether it be through direct sports teaching during curriculum time or through lunchtime or extra-curricular after school provision.

PE Curriculum

We have used the Primary School Sport Premium to enhance our provision by focusing on the use of a Cluster Sports Competition organiser to plan and run a wide range of sports competition across the Cluster schools and County wide. Also to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sporting provision for all pupils in addition to providing staff development.

Our highly skilled PE coach Mr Colbeck will continue to work with our KS1 and KS2 classes. Class teachers will work alongside Mr Colbeck and our PE Co-ordinator Miss Betts to enhance their own skills in PE teaching.

In addition, KS2 pupils have swimming lessons at Hobart pool with suitably qualified staff to enable them to swim 25 m. This is tailored to their swimming ability and they have the opportunity to gain recognised swimming awards.

Year 5/6's residential visit focuses on outdoor and adventurous activity challenges such as rock climbing, abseiling, canoeing, rafting, archery and orienteering. Provision of places for children in receipt of pupil premium in after school sports clubs and holiday courses.

We will also be using part of our PE Premium to pay for sustainable equipment for our new school hall; this will be PE equipment, such as large gym apparatus such as springboards and crash mats as well as badminton equipment which we have not been able to utilise before due to space constraints and will widen the scope of PE experiences for our children.

Extra-Curricular and Competitive Sport

Over the course of the academic year we offer a range of sports clubs after school for various year groups. For example:

Multi Sports - Key Stage 1 and 2

Netball - Year 5 and 6

Football - Key Stage 1 and 2

Rugby - Years 4, 5 and 6
Quick stick hockey Y 4, 5 and 6
Cricket Y 5& 6

Cross Country - Years 4, 5 and 6
Street Dance - Key Stage 1 and 2
Gym Club – KS1 and KS2

We take an active part South Norfolk School Sports Partnership.

We have taken part in a number of football, netball, cricket, rugby, athletics, tennis swimming and hockey competitions over the course of the year. Some of these are Cluster competitions and some feed into the School Games.

We have achieved a number of major honours in sporting competitions namely representing:

South Norfolk in the Sports Hall Athletics and Hockey in 2013, 2014 and 2015 - 16

South Norfolk in Swimming 2014.

South Norfolk Tag-Rugby in 2015

County cross country 15-16

To date: 81% of pupils take part in after school clubs and 74% take part in out of school sports clubs.

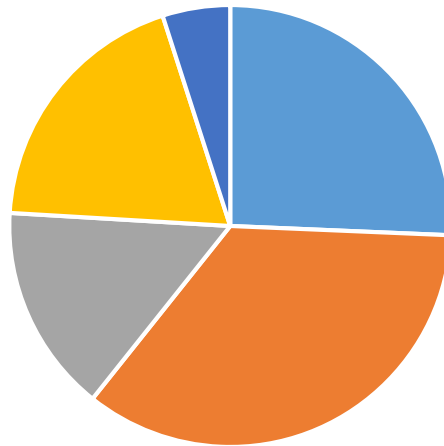
Many children have joined local hockey, rugby, gym and athletics groups after experiencing the sport at school first.

In summer 2016 the school organised and participated in two weeks of sports as part of the Alington Olympics, every child in KS2 took part in at least three sporting activities as well as all children being an active participator in sports day

Our aim is for all children to have access to sport and where possible every child who wishes to is given the opportunity to represent their school at least once in a sporting fixture whilst attending Alington & Bergh Apton Primary and for children to be active, healthy children. Increasing numbers of children are participating in sports competitions and festivals.
