If you have a large vehicle and park on the junction then it really does restrict visibility. In addition please do not park on the zig-zags at the beginning and end of the school day. I was trying to help someone across the road and two cars were blocking visibility up Wheel Road. This is so dangerous. If you are worried about being late to collect your child then don't worry we aren't rushing off anywhere and we will always take the child back into school until you arrive. It is much better to park further away and walk, even if you then arrive a few minutes late.
